Back-To-School Shopping Buying Online vs Going To The Store

The month of August, the last of the summer months. On August 2, we celebrated Friendship Day and August 13 was National Lefthanders Day. It's also National Family Month and Get Ready for Kindergarten Month. August marks the start of the new school year, which means parents are trying to stock up on school supplies, clothes and other essential items for their children.

In 2014, parents spent an average of \$370 on back-to-school shopping. The most in-demand items that year included notebooks and pens, clothes, shoes, backpacks and lunchboxes. This year, the average family with children in grades K-12 plan to spend \$630.36 on electronics, apparel and other school needs.

Parents, keep in mind that retailers tend to deeply discount back-to-school items that are still on the shelves in September and October. The key is to buy just enough supplies for the first few weeks of school, then purchase the remaining items at a great discount later.

You can buy practically anything online, but that doesn't mean you'll always want to, or ought to.

Shopping online is convenient. It saves time for parents who are already struggling to merge their kids' school commitments into their already jam-packed schedule. The average online shopping experience is around ten minutes, most in-store shoppers spent at least 30 minutes to make their purchases. Don't forget about the drive time to and from the store. However, you need to consider the inconvenience of waiting for your supplies to arrive. Shipping times can vary by vendor, and your order could arrive in different shipments. Don't forget about shipping charges. Online retailers often mark-up items slightly because online shoppers do not expect deals, they're looking for convenience.

According to Consumer Reports, school supplies should not be bought online.

StellaService, a customer service firm out of New York, reported that the average cost of purchasing the typical list of school supplies, pens, pencils, paper, binders, etc., in a store was 41% cheaper than buying them online.

Consumers still prefer physical stores for back-to-school shopping, with 83% of their purchases involving physical stores, including 7% of purchases that will be made online and picked up in-store. Of those who will order online and pick-up instore, 79% said they are likely to buy additional items once in the store.

Here are some helpful shopping strategies: Shop with a list. Research deals, promotions and sales. Read the "fine print" in ads. Avoid the crowds. Find and organize coupons. Set a budget. Check the store's return policy, especially purchasing a big ticket item (electronics).

The City of Irwin is located in Northeast Shelby County with a population of 341. It is a quiet community with friendly people who help each other when needed. The housing is reasonable and the taxes are low and we have updated utilities including fiber optic. Irwin has a Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Unit. These volunteer departments are a great asset to the community. They have helped the community in numerous ways.

Irwin has a Grade School that includes Preschool through third grade. There are 3 churches, United Methodist Church, St. Paul's Lutheran Church and the Church of Christ. Businesses in the area include Robinson Implement, Irwin Country Store, Pete's Frame Shop, Hanson Body Shop, Andy's Auto, O'Hara's Steakhouse, West Irwin Agency, A&Z Carwash and Laundromat, Shelby County State Bank, Richards Enterprises, Little Xtra Hair Care and Gifts, Becky's Beauty Shop, Irwin Locker and Catering, West Central Co-op Elevator, West Central 360 Feeds, Knudson Service Station, Farm Service Co-op, Al Plumb Dozer Service, Pete's Auto, R & R Storage, and Gawley Tire and Repair. Also in Irwin there are two daycares, one is TLC Daycare and Renae Wiig operates the other one.

Irwin has a Community Building that is rented out for family reunions, weddings, graduations and business meetings. The Community Building has a bar if needed for events. Community Building is located next to the City Park that includes a ballfield that is used for the IKM-Manning High School Softball games. The Park also has a Shelter House and a Playground. The Shelter House may be used on a first come, first serve basis. It is used for family reunions, birthday parties, graduations, etc. There is also a Museum that is open by appointment. The Lied Public Library is open 2-3 hours, 4 days a week and the City Clerk's office is in the Library Building there is also a meeting room that is used for playing cards and church group meetings and neighborhood group meetings. The previous Grade School is a private residence now and they use part of the building for their Genealogy and will give tours by appointment.

One mile northeast of Irwin is a Walking Trail where the railroad tracks used to be.




FORK IN ROAD with sheree clark
